Definition: To plan, organize, direct, and supervise wastewater collection and storm drain systems within the Utilities Section; and to perform a variety of technical tasks relative to assigned area of responsibility.

Supervision Received and Exercised: Receives direction from the Utilities Services Manager; exercises direct supervision over assigned maintenance, clerical, and technical personnel. May temporarily assume the duties of the Utilities Services Manager in their absence.

Examples of Duties: Duties may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- 1. Recommend and assist in the implementation of goals and objectives; establish schedules and methods for wastewater collection and storm drain systems; implement policies and procedures.
- 2. Plan, prioritize, assign, supervise, and review the work of staff involved in the operation and maintenance of the wastewater collection and storm drain systems.
- 3. Evaluate operations and activities of assigned responsibilities; recommend improvements and modifications; prepare various reports on operations and maintenance activities.
- 4. Participate in budget preparation and administration; prepare cost estimates for budget recommendations; submit justifications for staff and equipment; monitor and control expenditures.
- 5. Participate in the selection of staff; provide or coordinate staff training; work with employees to correct deficiencies; implement discipline procedures.
- 6. Answer questions and provide information to the public; investigate complaints and recommend corrective action as necessary to resolve complaints.
- 7. Monitor and control supplies and equipment; order supplies and tools as necessary; prepare documents for equipment procurement.
- 8. Assist with preparation of requests for proposals and bid specifications.

9. Oversee the most complex wastewater collection and storm drain system operation and maintenance duties; provide technical assistance to crews.

- 10. Coordinate with contractors to provide professional and maintenance services.
- 11. Monitor and implement pertinent local, State, and Federal regulations for wastewater and stormwater operations. Provide information required to obtain and maintain required wastewater and stormwater permits.
- 12. Administer safety program for wastewater operation. Ensure staff participates in required training.
- 13. Perform related duties as assigned.

Minimum Qualifications:

Knowledge of: Principles and practices of wastewater collection system and storm drain design, construction, operation, and maintenance; pump stations, equipment, tools, and materials used in the maintenance, repair, and installation of wastewater and stormwater collection and pumping systems; principles of supervision, training, and performance evaluation; principles of municipal budget administration; modern office procedures, methods, and computer equipment and related software; principles and practices of safety management and training related to area of responsibility; and pertinent local, State, and Federal laws, ordinances, and rules.

Ability to: Organize, implement, and direct an effective wastewater collection system and storm drain maintenance program; interpret and explain pertinent division and department policies and procedures; assist in the development and monitoring of an assigned program budget; determine sewer and storm drain condition using video inspections and other analytical tools; effectively use computers and office/operations software; develop and recommend systems and procedures related to assigned operations; develop cost estimates for supplies and equipment; establish and maintain effective working relationships with those contacted in the course of work; communicate clearly and concisely, both orally and in writing; and supervise, train, and evaluate assigned staff.

Experience and Training Guidelines: Combination of relevant experience, education, and training that will satisfy the required minimum qualification, knowledge, and abilities.

Three years of increasingly responsible experience in wastewater collection system maintenance and/or wastewater treatment plant experience, which includes two years of experience as a lead. Training equivalent to the completion of the 12th

grade supplemented by community college course work in supervisory management or the City's supervisory training course.

Required Licenses or Certificates: Possession of a valid California Class C driver's license. Possession of a Grade II Collection Systems Maintenance Certificate issued by the California Water Environment Association (CWEA). Highly desirable: a CWEA Grade I Mechanical Technologist Certificate.

Working Conditions: Preemployment and periodic respiratory examinations may be required for this classification.
